

Seminar on the ICC & India
18 Dec 2006

At the invitation of ILS Law College, Pune, the ICC-India campaign will conduct a three hour seminar on International Criminal Court & India, on 18 December 2007. Participants will be students enrolled in an undergraduate diploma course on human rights. The seminar will be conducted by Ms. Saumya Uma, Co-ordinator, ICC-India who will give a brief overview of the ICC, including: the context of impunity in the global and Indian contexts, international attempts at creating accountability for mass crimes, advancements made through and criticisms to Nuremberg, Tokyo tribunals as well as Rwandan and Bosnian tribunals, and how the ICC was different from them, the differences between the ICC and International Court of Justice, the concept of individual criminal responsibility, the crimes within the jurisdiction of the ICC and the present global ratification status.

Students will receive five relevant articles to facilitate small group discussions.
